Preventing Elder Abuse and Neglect in Older Adults ...

If you are a mandatory reporter and you witness or become aware that an at-risk elder has been or is at imminent risk for mistreatment (abuse, caretaker neglect, or exploitation), by law you must make a report to law enforcement within 24 hours. An at-risk elder is any person who is 70 years of age or older.

Types of Elder Abuse. It can happen in different ways: Physical abuse is any action that causes injury or bodily harm. It can include hitting, shoving, kicking, or burning an older person, tying him to a bed or wheelchair, locking him in a room, or giving him drugs his doctor hasn ' t prescribed. Often this kind of abuse shows up as visible injuries.
