### Ensuring Quality Cancer Care through the Oncology ...

An NCI-sponsored study found that family caregivers of patients with cancer spend an average of 20 hours per week providing care, with more than half providing care daily. 19 Oncology professionals need training on how to collaborate and coordinate care with family members and provide the caregivers with the necessary medical information to administer quality care.

The report recommends systems changes to improve the likelihood that more people will receive high-quality cancer care in the future.

Recommendation 5. Ensure quality of care at the end of life, in particular, the management of cancer-related pain and timely referral to palliative and hospice care. Early referral to palliative care significantly decreases symptom burden and also may increase survival among patients with advanced lung cancer.

A shortage of other health care professionals involved in providing oncology care, such as public health workers, social workers, pharmacists, and laboratory workers and technicians, will also affect the quality of cancer care throughout the entire continuum, from prevention to late-stage disease (see Table 2).

### Ensuring Quality Cancer Care Through the Oncology Workforce

The purpose of this workshop was to discuss the possibilities for improving and ensuring the quality of cancer care through the oncology workforce. There is strong evidence that the U.S. oncology workforce is going to experience labor shortages resulting from an aging population and an inadequate number of new professionals being trained.

### Ensuring Quality Cancer Care through the Oncology ...

The CoC has sought to fulfill its goal of ensuring the delivery of comprehensive, high-quality cancer care by setting standards, conducting compliance surveys, collecting standardized data from its accredited programs to better measure quality, using data to monitor treatment patterns and outcomes to enhance clinical surveillance activities, and developing effective educational interventions to improve care delivery and outcomes.
