Overall, evidence to support the effectiveness of laws hypothesized to reduce underage drinking is mixed. Some studies indicate that, for college students, underage drinking is more likely to decrease when there are multiple policies in place (Wechsler, Lee et al. 2002; Nelson, Naimi et al. 2005), indicating that it may be the combination of policies or the number of policies that make a difference.
